York School District One Referendum 2024 Community Conversation has scheduled several informational sessions; September 30th at Church of the Good Shepherd 108 E Liberty St, York. **Tuesday, October 8th, at the Sharon Community Center 3722 Woodlawn St, Sharon** and October 16th at York County Government Center 6 S Congress St, York. Each session begins at 6 pm.

On June 11, 2024, the York School District One Board of Trustees unanimously approved holding a referendum on November 5, 2024, to fund construction projects to accommodate growth in York School District One. As a part of the general election on November 5, 2024, residents of York School District One will decide whether to issue general obligation bonds of the School District not to exceed \$90,000,000 through one referendum question. Must Section 4, Article II of the Constitution of this State, relating to voter qualifications, be amended so as to provide that only a citizen of the United States and of this State of the age of eighteen and upwards who is properly registered is entitled to vote as provided by law?

Shall the Board of Trustees of School District No. 1 of York County, South Carolina (the "School District"), be empowered to issue, either at one time as a single issue or from time to time as several separate issues, general obligation bonds of the School District in the aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$90,000,000, the proceeds of which shall be used to finance the costs of a comprehensive education capital improvement project (including architectural, engineering, legal and related fees) of the following: 1. The construction, expansion, renovation and equipping of Pinckney Street Learning Center/York One Academy to become an early childhood center; 2. The construction and equipping of a new middle school facility; 3. The acquisition of real property; and 4. The renovation, expansion, and equipping of existing facilities of the School District.

Hurricane Helene Update

The latest information from SC Emergency Management, Right now, there is an increasing concern about damaging wind from Hurricane <u>#Helene</u> impacting South Carolina. The National Hurricane Center reports a high potential for damaging hurricane-force winds gusts in the Upstate and western Midlands beginning later this evening. Threats to SC remain: -Heavy rainfall -Flash flooding -Tornadoes -Strong gusty winds. 4 to 9 inches of rain has already fallen in parts of the Upstate, and additional rain is expected today and tomorrow. Please remember these important safety reminders from Duke Energy:
