Sharon Fire Department was host to our great vendors again this year! So, many lovely, handmade items to choose from.














1. Ordinance 16 - That all livestock, poultry, and other animals shall be under the control of the owner at all times and said owner shall be held liable for any and all damages done to the person or property of others by said livestock, poultry, or other animals.



Don't forget, York County Collection and Recycling will accept Christmas trees (live only with no ornaments or lights, etc. on the tree) for recycling December 26<sup>th</sup>-January 31<sup>st</sup>. Christmas lights can also be recycled—look for a labeled roll-cart at the center.
